



Witnessing

In study eight we mentioned that God gives every individual gifts and ministries. One person may have a pastoral ministry gift, while another person may be given one of the gifts listed in 1 COR 12: 1-30.

There is one ministry that Jesus gave to all of us. That ministry is simply telling other people about Him and what He has done for our lives.

Read 2 COR 5:15-20.

1. When you hear the word ‘witness’ you probably think of a court room where legal proceedings take place. A witness is someone who testifies to an incident they may have seen or heard. In a similar way, God wants us to tell the people we know what He has done for us.

1 JN 1:1-3 “We proclaim to you what we have _____ and _____”.

2. Although you may not have physically seen Jesus you can still tell people about what He has done for you.

3. A witness only has to tell others what they saw/heard – not what they heard from another person. You only need to tell others what you personally have experienced.
4. Read ACTS 4:1-31. These Christians often paid a big price for telling people about Jesus. Some were put in prison, some were tortured and many lost their lives. The Greek word for witness means ‘martyr’. It is important to note that these people were killed because they were martyrs (witnesses); they were not called martyrs because they were killed.

5. When you become a Christian, telling people about Jesus will become very natural. When Andrew started to follow Jesus the first thing he did was tell his brother.

Jesus Empowers Us

On your own, you do not have the ability to be an effective witness. You will remember from Study Seven that Jesus gives you the power to be a great witness.

The Holy Spirit gives you the ability to be –

A witness - to live a life that glorifies God

A verbal witness – to tell people about Jesus and what He did for you

2. **Remember** - Even without verbally being a witness you are still a witness wherever you are, and whatever you do. Once you tell people you are a Christian, they will notice the actions and reactions you have to every experience in your life. Aim to live a life that is pleasing to God. You will be most effective as a witness by the way you live your life around your friends, family and neighbours.
